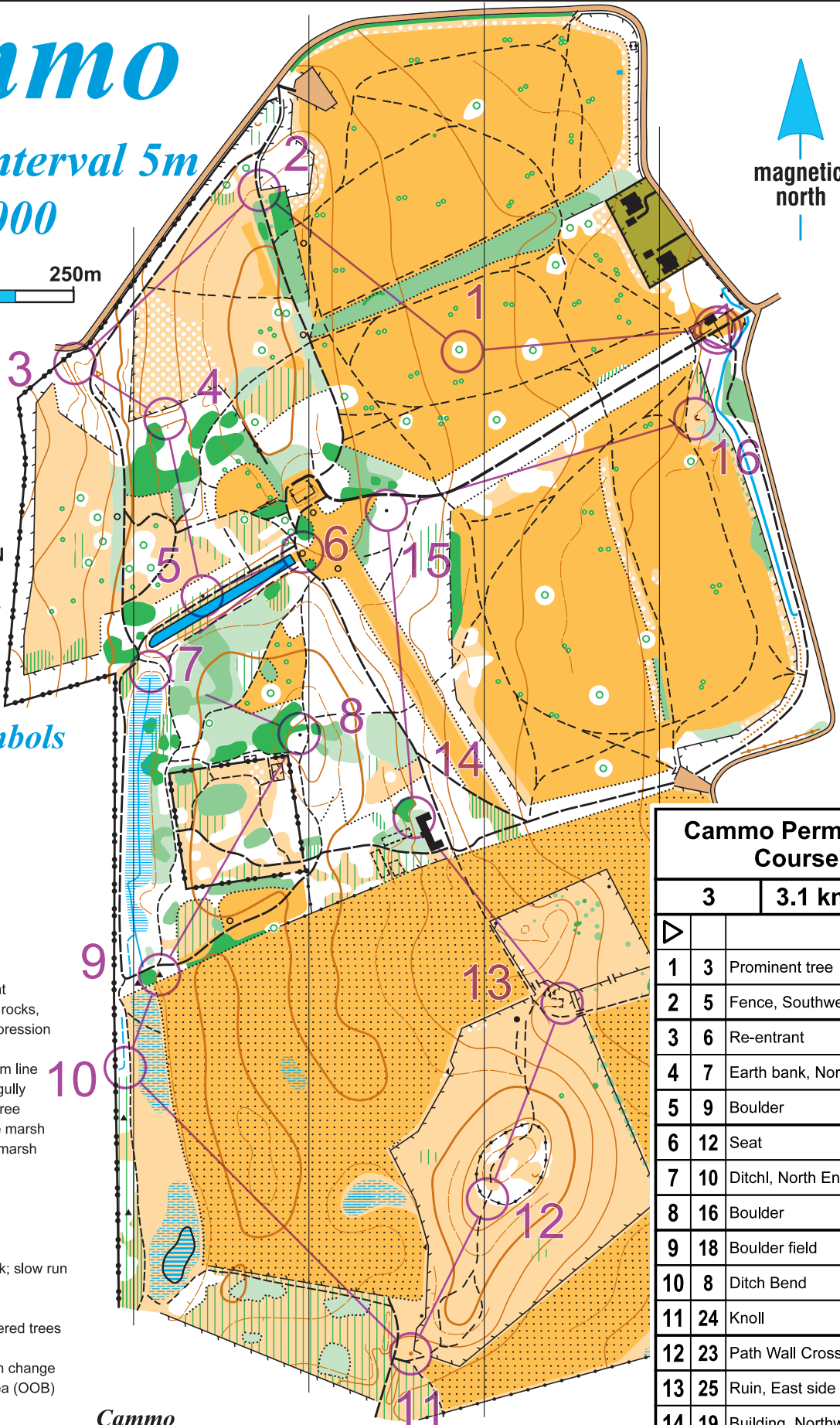

Baron Clerk of Penicuik, owner of Cammo in the early 18th century, planted most of the trees on the estate and was at the forefront of the "Landscape Movement", a fashion among land owners to design the countryside around their houses to be attractive but look natural. The estate was gifted to the National Trust for Scotland in 1980 and is maintained by the City of Edinburgh Council.
