




Let's look at map symbols and how a more complicated map can be understood by looking at the different colours and symbols











The Map






Start with blank page and add North Lines. Suggests the whole area is a totally flat runnable forest.






Add open land and rough open land






Add other vegetation: Forest Walk and Forest Fight






Add blue for water Streams, rivers and marsh





Add Man-made objects Walls, fences and gates








Add roads, tracks and footpaths




Finally add the contours The area is not flat but is on a hillside
